TIM'S SERVICE

This March I've been blessed to participate in two thought-provoking gatherings outside the office (and you know getting away from the office, even if work-related, can be a real blessing).

The first gathering was sponsored by the base chapel and brought together ministers and spiritual support organizations from across the region surrounding Wright-Patterson AFB, OH. The intent was focused as a start of something truly special in providing spiritual care for the Total Force Team here at Wright-Patterson. Throughout the day we learned about the heart the Chaplaincy has for the spiritual welfare of the entire base populace. One concern you may already understand is that the U.S. Chaplaincy, by U.S. Title, is technically restricted to providing ministry only to those in uniform. To illustrate the concern, WPAFB has a working population of over 25,000 people. Around 26% of those people wear the uniform. That means approximately 74% of the base population actually lacks dedicated spiritual support while on base. In the ongoing process, the chapel will be seeking ways to build a community that cares for all Airmen in the Dayton region. Would you pray for success in that focus? I'd appreciate it since, besides being a pastor, I'm actually one of the intended targets of this ministry!

The second event was actually part of a USAF sponsored character and leadership initiative. The focus is for all AF personnel to gain a better



understanding of how professionalism drives individual member behavior. A premise for the activity: Understanding humans in relation to decision making is fundamentally important to the development of effective leaders. Leaders must not only understand how and why humans do what they do, they must also know how to develop environments that encourage an increased level of commitment, loyalty and trust. The world is constantly changing. In consequence, so are the demands on the military. We cannot simply expect to succeed by doing things the same way we have in the past. We have to remain agile.

As mentioned, both the events I participated in were indeed thought provoking. One was spiritually focused. The second, though not spiritually focused, certainly has application within the Body of Christ. Community of Christ encourages us to be Christ to the world of the present. God leads us forward. He does not wall us in (though we may sometimes be prone to wanting to wall God in!). In the testimony of scripture, God also challenges us, according to our gifts and talents, to understand our fellow disciples, and to lead others to a knowledge of Christ. The world is constantly changing. In consequence, so are the demands on the Church. We cannot simply expect to succeed by doing things the same way we have in the past. We have to remain agile. I pray for your growing leadership.



Easter Blessings. The Lenten journey may have seemed long. Before our Easter celebration we will have had to face the reality of the cross. Yet, Easter approaches soon. In a unified Alleluia we may proclaim "He is risen!" As an old hymn reminds: Because He lives, we can face tomorrow; because He lives, all fear can be gone; because we know He holds the future, and life is worth the living, just because He lives!
