TIM'S SERVICE

In many ways, this is a unique edition of the Peacekeeper newsletter. First, it fills a gap covering the months of July through October 2016. Second, this edition may be light on article content even while it goes heavy in the area of *hope*.

By way of reminder, as of this past World Conference, my term as President had expired and so had the term of Jennifer Redfern, as Secretary. A lack of attendees at our scheduled business meeting has forced a need for an alternate plan to cover the necessary elections. As a result, we called for an election of officers using a combination of e-mail and paper ballot. In our last edition (May, June) I asked: "Where are you? Community of Christ Association for Ministry to Military Personnel Peacekeepers: Where are you in the effort to provide ministry to those of Community of Christ serving on active duty in the military?"

In answer to that call, we had two nominees step forward. Jennifer Redfern has let her name stand as our nominee for the office of Secretary. Ryan Pitt, serving most recently as the Mid-Atlantic Mission Center President, has allowed his name to stand as nominee for the office of Association President.

As an introduction, here is Ryan Pitt's Bio:

Originally from Lamoni, IA, Ryan Pitt graduated from Graceland University's Community of Christ Leadership Program and a degree in Health Care Management in 2012. He started working in Bethesda, MD as an Office Manager for an Oral Surgeon while simultaneously pursuing his Masters



in Health Administration (MHA) from Mount St. Mary's University. Working and pursuing his graduate degree full-time, Ryan assumed various leadership roles with the Washington, D.C. Congregation. His leadership roles included: Young Adult Coordinator, Pastoral Leadership Team Member, Leading Congregations in Mission, Pastoral Counselor, and Co-Pastor. After completing his MHA in 2015, he began working full-time for the Mid-Atlantic Mission Center as Mission Center President. Ryan and his wife, Emma, currently live in York, PA. In his free time he enjoys watching movies, spending time on the water, hanging out with friends, and traveling the country with his wife and 9-year old dog, Henry.

Ryan also provided us with a PERSONAL STATEMENT which I trust you will find meaningful for our military ministry focus:

My time and ministry in the Washington, D.C. area fuels my aspiration to join the U.S. Navy Chaplain Corp. Working in Bethesda, many of our patients were either military or part of a military family and I frequently noticed the need for religious support and reminder of God's love. Furthermore, my congregational leadership experience revealed a need for specialized ministry with Community of Christ members and friends in the military. I realized our servicemen and women often feel a separation from God's love through

the decisions, sacrifices, actions, and experiences endured serving our country. I feel called to be a minister of presence with all God's children in places standard pastors can't reach. Currently, I am applying to Princeton University, Claremont School of Theology, and Lancaster Theological Seminary to obtain my M.Div. to begin responding to God's call and serve as a Naval Chaplain.

In light of these developments I commend to you our two nominees and want you to be aware that both have the full endorsement of the Association leadership. I ask you to vote using either the mail-in form at the end of the newsletter, or by e-mail. I know this is a busy season but we ask your prayerful and attentive support to the Association's official needs. Voting will close upon receipt of the last ballot received by e-mail on calendar date 15 December 2016, or (if using the postal system) that had been postmarked as of that date. Please vote!

And, as the Christmas season fast approaches, I pray with you for Peace on Earth (Christ's Peace) and for our focus on honoring God as stewards of creation. May the remembrance of the birth of our Savior touch each of your hearts with joy!
